Richard T. Broderick is a Registered Architect and member of the Northwest Washington and national chapters of the American Institute of Architects (AIA). He holds a Bachelors of Architecture degree from Penn State University and a Masters of Architecture degree from Ohio State University.

Throughout his 30 plus year career he's been involved in over 2 billion dollars worth of high profile construction work. He has the broadest experience in all aspects of planning, design and construction including roles as design architect, project manager, author of national design standards, international construction executive, college instructor, contracting officer, and Branch Chief for a major Federal design and construction office in Los Angeles. A career highlight was his management of the conversion of the historic U.S. Pension Building in Washington D.C. into the National Building Museum, the Smithsonian's gallery devoted to American architecture and engineering. One of his last major positions was as Project Executive for the design and construction of Pritzker prize-winning architect, Thom Mayne's Eugene Courthouse, a wildly celebrated and groundbreaking project which has garnered over a dozen international design awards. He also served as Project Manager for the design and construction of the \$100M Peace Arch Border Station and the \$120M conversion of the Edith Green Federal Building in downtown Portland into what was mandated to be the most sustainable and "greenest" federal building in the country.

As mentioned in the introduction though, Richard's passion remains with small scale residential and light construction projects where the intimacy of client and builder interaction produce the most responsive and successful design outcome.
